 Do you think he is critical, neutral or hopeful about his situation? Explain your answer.
- 5 Compare the beginning and the end of the text. What changes in the narrator's tone or attitude? Then, do you think living in nature (like in Central Park) can help someone feel free or peaceful? Why or why not?

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


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
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
